This online festival was an opportunity to virtually bring together stakeholders, academics and other experts from the 7 living laboratories of the project (Spain, Italy, Greece, Slovakia, Peru - Chile - Bolivia, Lebanon - Syria - Turkey, and India) and especially to stimulate respectful and constructive debate on the design and implementation of transformational adaptation policies (TAPs) under deep uncertainty. The exchanges during the webstival were based on the **Talanoa Dialogue**: an inclusive, participatory and transparent conversation to explore current challenges in water resources management, identify gaps, with a focus on modelling, and collectively identify ways to achieve sustainable and equitable welfare and economic growth.

FUTURE EVENTS

In the next half of 2024, partners will be engaged in the implementation of project goals, meetings and the second round of local workshops during summer. In particular, the **General Assembly** will be held in Uppsala in February and 8 **deliverables** on modelling, finance, scenathons, and reports will be finalised.
