Loopia was formed in 2013 by Antonis Voumvoulakis on guitar, bass, keyboards, and loops, and Irida Tsigara on vocals and voice loops. Drawing inspiration from musicians around the world, they began experimenting with advanced musical instruments, technology, and live looping techniques to explore new soundscapes. From these experiments, their first original compositions were born, such as "Sinuk" with symphonic orchestration and a short film-style music video, as well as "Jupsee" and "Papagei", where they collaborated with renowned drummer Alexandros Drakos-Ktistakis. In 2020, they welcomed the exceptional young drummer Nikos Sygletos to the group, transforming Loopia into a trio. Since then, they have performed at major festivals in Crete and throughout Greece.

Beethoven's Septet, although a relatively youthful work, far from the intense passions and robust drama that so strongly characterize his later works, was one of his most popular pieces during his lifetime — and remains so today, thanks to the freshness of its themes and the liveliness of the interaction among the performers. A similar sentiment applies to Tchaikovsky's Sextet, where the composer, in his twilight years, seeks his lost innocence in the immortal Italian melodiousness while simultaneously delving into the profound depths of his passionate Russian soul.

The wind and percussion orchestra presents beloved works from the international repertoire, full of vitality and dynamism.










